The objectives of this project are to increase pollinator habitat at the Furnace and Foster Tracts of Pocomoke State Forest through increasing the acreage of early successional habitat, increasing the coverage of pollen and nectar plants, and removing less desirable species including planted loblolly pine, maple and sweet gum. Fourth Quarter habitat management activities included mowing approximately two acres on the Foster Tract (map attached) in preparation for planting a wildflower seed mix. The fall burns that were planned were not executed due to unfavorable weather conditions although fire breaks were created in the Control Unit. We expect to complete this portion of the project by the end date of 28 February 2020.

Were planned goals/objectives achieved last quarter? Fall burns were not executed due to unfavorable weather conditions.

<u>Progress Achieved</u>: (For each Goal/Objective, list Planned and Actual Accomplishments) Habitat management activities included mowing approximately two acres on the Foster Tract in preparation for planting a wildflower seed mix. The seed was ordered and will be planted in spring 2020. Fire breaks were created in a section of the Control Unit of the Furnace Tract (we planned to burn about half the Unit); the fall burn may occur during the winter 2020 if conditions permit; otherwise it will be postponed until the fall 2020. Some additional trees (pines and cherries) were thinned in the Furnace Control Unit and the stumps were treated with herbicide.

Difficulties Encountered: None.

Activities Anticipated Next Quarter: The only planned task to be completed before the current contract expires (28 February) is to burn half of the Control Unit on the Furnace Tract, but this may be postponed until the fall 2020 if weather conditions are unfavorable.
